SEVENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME - 23rd FEBRUARY 2025

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 6:27-38), Jesus challenges us with a radical call: "*Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you.*" These words may seem difficult, even impossible, yet they reveal the heart of Christian discipleship—love without limits.

This Gospel is at the core of what Divine Renovation encourages us to embrace: a Parish that is outward-looking, merciful, and mission-driven. A vibrant Parish is not just about programs or Sunday attendance; it is about transformation—allowing Christ's mercy to shape our lives so that we reflect His love in our families, workplaces, and communities.

Jesus calls us to go beyond what is comfortable. He asks us not just to forgive but to bless those who hurt us. He asks us to give generously, expecting nothing in return. This is the love that renews hearts and Parishes. When we choose mercy over resentment and generosity over selfishness, we become a witness to Our Lord Jesus Christ's presence in the world.

As we pray and reflect on this Gospel, let us also remember Pope Francis, who has continually urged the Church to be a "field hospital," a place of healing and encounter. We pray for his speedy recovery, that he may continue to lead us with wisdom and strength.

LOVE YOUR ENEMIES

Jesus teaches us to love our enemies, do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us, and pray for those who mistreat us. This radical call to love goes beyond the natural human inclination to seek revenge or harbour resentment.

These words challenge us to move beyond our natural inclinations and embrace a love that knows no bounds. This is not a call to passivity or weakness, but a call to active, courageous love that can transform hearts and communities.

Jesus continues by instructing us to turn the other cheek and give freely to those in need. He emphasises the Golden Rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you." This principle of reciprocity encourages us to break the cycle of retribution and violence, fostering a culture of kindness and respect. In a world where revenge and retaliation often prevail, Jesus' teachings offer a path to true peace and reconciliation.

Furthermore, Jesus speaks of forgiveness and generosity. "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." These words remind us that our actions have consequences, and that our generosity will be rewarded by God. By extending grace to others, we mirror the abundant grace that God has lavished upon us.

Living out these teachings is no easy task. It requires us to let go of our pride, our desire for revenge, and our need for recognition. It calls us to love unconditionally, even when it is difficult or painful. But in doing so, we become true disciples of Christ, embodying His love and bringing His kingdom to earth. May we strive to live out these radical teachings, knowing that in doing so, we reflect the very heart of God.
