In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus speaks of powerful signs - darkened skies, stars falling, and the arrival of the Son of Man in glory. These images may feel intense, even unsettling, but they carry a hopeful promise. Jesus assures us that, though heaven and earth may pass away, His words and promises will never fail us.

As we near the end of our liturgical church year, we are invited to reflect on Christ's coming and the promise of His eternal kingdom. This is especially meaningful in November, the Month of All Souls, as we remember and pray for our loved ones who have passed away. In our prayers, we place our hope in Christ's victory over death and His promise of eternal life.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

We are currently refreshing our Parish Council. This will mean a new Chair and better ethnic community representation. The first job of the new council will be to develop a new Pastoral Plan, which will guide our parish through the next several years. All parishioners will be asked to express their opinions to guide us along this road. Our first steps are:

STEP ONE - Create an Ethnic Pastoral Team made up of one representative of each of our ethnic communities. The co-ordinator will be elected by the team members and will also become a member of the Parish Council. This will enable the views of all communities to be included on Council discussions. This step has already begun.

STEP TWO - ask all parishioners to complete a simple questionnaire which will show the Parish Council their priorities and the direction we need to follow. We have chosen the Feast of Christ the King to distribute the questionnaire. We think this is the most appropriate time because of its significance as the end of one liturgical year and the start of another.

We will continue to keep you informed as we progress.
