FORTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Now is a time of anticipation and reflection as we prepare for the coming of Christ. This Sunday, we light the final candle on the Advent wreath, symbolising peace. The readings remind us of the fulfilment of God's promises and the peace that comes with the birth of Jesus.

In the Gospel of Luke, we hear the story of the Annunciation, where the angel Gabriel visits Mary to announce that she will bear the Son of God. Mary's response is one of faith and obedience, saying, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word." Her acceptance of God's will brings peace to her heart and sets the stage for the birth of the Savior.

As we reflect on this story, we are reminded of the importance of saying "yes" to God's plan for our lives. Just as Mary trusted in God's promise, we too are called to trust in His intention for us. This trust brings peace, even in the midst of uncertainty and challenges.

The Fourth Sunday of Advent also calls us to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ.
